**1.0 GENERAL**

- 1.1 The traditional New Bedford Yacht Club Whalers Race dates back to 1932.
- 1.2 The race starts and finishes outside Padanaram Harbor and includes marks off Cuttyhunk Island, Nomans Land and Block Island. Buzzards Horn is left to port on the return trip.

**2.0 RULES**

- 2.1 The race will be governed by the *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 2.2 All yachts shall comply with the U.S. Sailing Safety Equipment Rules for Coastal Racing with the following modifications:  
For Monohulls, Section 3.7.2 (Additional Man Overboard Pole), Section 3.16.2 (EPIRB/PLB) and Section 4.3.2 (Safety at Sea Seminar) are all strongly recommended but not required.  
For Multihulls, all of the above modifications, and, in addition, 2.2.2 (Stability Index) is waived.
- 2.3 All yachts must submit the Certificate of Compliance handed out with the Sailing Instructions. **No finish will be recognized without a completed and signed Certificate.** The Certificate must be signed by the owner or skipper and the navigator. The Certificate must be filed at the New Bedford Yacht Club office by 0900, Sunday, June 23rd or within one hour of finishing if finishing after 0800.

**3.0 SCHEDULE**

- 3.1 There will be a skippers' meeting at 1900 hours at NBYC on Friday, June 21, 2019 in the Rothschild Room.
- 3.2 The warning sound for the first class will be at 1100 hours on Saturday, June 22, 2019.

**4.0 CLASSES AND DIVISIONS**

- 4.1 Multihulls crewed  
PHRF Classes:  
    Spinnaker & Non Spinnaker,  
    Double handed Spinnaker & Non Spinnaker
- 4.2 If there are not enough double handed entries, they will be scored in cruising or racing class and also qualify for double handed trophies.

**5.0 ELIGIBILITY**

- 5.1 The regatta is open to all yachts with a minimum overall length of 21 feet.
- 5.2 Owners must have a 2019 PHRF-NE certificate or a 2019 NEMA certificate.

- 6.1 A completed entry form along with a 2018 PHRF-NE certificate or a 2018 NEMA certificate must be submitted to the NBYC office by 1700 hours on Friday, June 21, 2019.
- 6.2 The entry fee is \$75.00 which includes breakfast on Sunday the 23rd.

G “7” Gong – Wilkes Ledge 2 miles southeast of Mishaum Point, leave to port

RG “AB” Gong - 1.8 miles south southeast of Padanaram breakwater, leave to port

NBYC Race Mark “A” – south of Padanaram breakwater

Start – RG “AB” Gong and Committee Boat

R “36” Bell - Sow and Pigs Reef southwest of Cuttyhunk Island, leave to port

Buzzards Horn - 3.7 miles southwest of Cuttyhunk Island, leave to port

G “7” Gong – Wilkes Ledge 2 miles southeast of Mishaum Point, leave to port

RG “AB” Gong - 1.8 miles south southeast of Padanaram breakwater, leave to port
